

Iceland Community Heroes Honoured by the Queen for their Service to the Community During Covid-19

Congratulations to Iceland Home Delivery Drivers **Adam Smith and Toni Salmon** who have been recognised in **Her Majesty the Queen's Birthday Honours List.**

Our two key worker colleagues will receive a **BEM (British Empire Medal)** for their exceptional service to Iceland customers and the communities we serve.

Recognised for providing a vital lifeline to some of Iceland's most vulnerable customers during the Covid-19 pandemic, Adam and Toni went above and beyond during the peak of the crisis.

Adam, from Iceland Rustington, and Toni, from Iceland Monmouth, were awarded for their dedication to and commitment to their communities by conducting check in calls, collecting shopping lists, and delivering essential supplies to those in need.

Surprised and delighted to receive the honour, Adam, pictured below, said "I started with Iceland last year in June after moving into the area from Watford. I was very shocked to be nominated and absolutely amazed to hear from the Cabinet Office to tell me that I was to receive the award. My family are very proud of what I have achieved, and when I told my father he was beaming with pride, even more so because he received a similar award over 25 years ago. I am so pleased that I was able to serve my community and give help to people when they had no one else to turn to."



His commitment is evidenced by the many letters of gratitude received by the store expressing thanks for both the practical help and kindness Adam showed to them.
